### STEWARDSHIP IS LIKE...

For the past month, as we always do in October, we have been thinking and talking about Stewardship, the call to use what we have to glorify God and further God's mission in the world. The first

step in the task is to recognize that we have resources whether they are tangible (finances, or intangible time) (abilities and interests) that may be employed glorify God and further God's mission in the world. We can struggle sometimes with the idea that what we have is significant enough to make a real difference to anyone in general and God in particular. This struggle named frequently

through scripture. Sarah laughed out loud when God said she would give birth, because she thought she was too old to conceive. Moses suggested that he wasn't eloquent enough to do the job God was giving him to do. Isaiah said, "I am only a boy" and Mary, a teen age girl, wondered at the bigness of the work that had been given to her. The thing is that none of their stories ended in doubt. Sarah conceived and became the mother of a nation. Moses lifted his voice and said to Pharaoh on behalf of God, "Let my people go!" became the prophet speaking words of inspiration to the generations and Mary,

Mary gave birth to the Savior. Each of them accomplished what God had set before them to do, because it was not just them who did it. God was at work in Sarah and Moses. God was at work

in Isaiah and Mary too. The good news is that God is at work in you and me, calling each one of us to offer up what seems too little, to insignificant to make any difference at all because with it he can change the world. This is the hope that lies behind our stewardship. When we feed someone who is hungry, God is at changing work the world. When we provide shelter for someone who

homeless, God is changing the world. When we take the time to listen to someone who is struggling, God is working to change the world.

Stewardship is like this, each one of us taking what seems too little, too insignificant and entrusting it to the God who is a work changing the world.


### PLEDGE DEDICATION SUNDAY


### **Community Meal:**


